Did you know?

Used aluminum beverage cans are the most recycled item in the U.S., but other types of aluminum such as siding, gutters, car components, storm

other types of aluminum, such as siding, gutters, car components, storm window frames, and lawn furniture can also be recycled.

- A used aluminum can is recycled and back on the grocery shelf as a new can, in as little as 60 days. That's closed loop recycling at its finest

We use over 80,000,000,000 aluminum soda cans every year.

- There is no limit to the amount of times an aluminum can be recycled

The average household throws away 13,000 separate pieces of paper each year. Most is packaging and junk mail.

- If you had a 15-year-old tree and made it into paper grocery bags, you'd get about 700 of them. A supermarket could use all of them in under an hour! This means in one year, one supermarket goes through 60,500,000 paper bags! Imagine how many supermarkets there are in the U.S.!!!
- Americans throw away 25,000,000,000 Styrofoam coffee cups every year
- Plastic bags and other plastic garbage thrown into the ocean kill as many as 1,000,000 sea creatures every year!

A typical family consumes 182 gallons of soda, 29 gallons of juice, 104 gallons of milk, and 26 gallons of bottled water a year.

That's a lot of containers -- make sure they're recycled!

What can you do? Be a Steward of God's Earth.

UNDER THE SEA "Fun-Raiser" Dinner



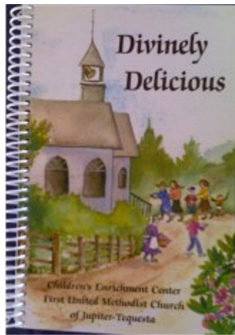
Friday, April 24th at 5:30 P.M.
